**Crozet Quilters** – Adrienne Granitz – The Crozet Chapter continues work on our charity quilts that includes Hospice, Bright Star, and Meals on Wheels. We are also working on our Quilt of Honor that will soon be ready for quilting, and a quilt for our host church in thanks for their generosity in providing a wonderful meeting space. The blocks for that quilt have been distributed with a fall completion date.

We had a pot-luck Spring Luncheon that is always a fun time. Meet the Quilter and Teachable Moments programs will take a summer break in July and August and pick up again in September as many members are out of town.

We've started planning for Spring Fest 2024, securing space in the Methodist church, setting a date for the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in May, and discussing possible speakers for the event. It is never too early to plan.

**Moonlighters** – Shawna O'Driscoll – Moonlighters Chapter has been growing since our move to The Center last year with 43 members. Moira MacAvoy has been the president since the first of the year. At our 2nd Wednesday meeting we have a Theme Show & Tell, during which we have shown and discussed: thread, needles, and other topics. Thread storage is coming up next. Then at our 4th Wednesday meetings we always have a "Scrap Swap" with a designated color and/or theme.

At the 5th Wednesday special interest meetings, in March, Ellen gave us a demo and let us try Inktense pencils. In May, Shawna O'Driscoll hosted at her house a computerized longarm demo Members were also able to try out a hand guided longarm. In addition, our chapter makes Fidget Quilts for donation to local nursing homes. This project is coordinated by Melinda Smith.

**Nelson Quilters** – Debbie Speilman – Our long time president, Becky Davis, has stepped down. Nadine Bird is the acting president until an officer election is held in the fall. The group has resumed having a bagged dinner together before the first meeting of each month. We are also resuming monthly activities during the second meeting of the month.

<u>Items completed</u>: On Memorial Day a quilt of valor was presented to Phi Gumm during Nelson's annual Veterans Day ceremony. Two community quilts have been given to families that have lost their home to fire. A list of officer duties for the Nelson Quilters has been approved by the group in preparation for officer elections in the fall. Three of our 4 officers are stepping down at the end of the year.

<u>Work in progress</u>: Work has begun on a quilt to be raffled by the Piney River Fire Department. Several members are working on quilts for next year's Early Childhood Special Education class at our local elementary school. Planning for Fall Fest continues.

**Grateful Threads** – Karen Burnette – Spring Fest on May 6th was a big success. Many thanks to Janet Saulsbury for her work to organize this.

Monthly presentations of our quilting knowledge continues. Linda Boone presented a lively session on irons in March, Karen Burnette talked about the history of pieced blocks in April, and Shawna O'Driscoll had a demonstration of long arm quilting in her home studio in May.

We continue to make guilts for the Bright Star Program and Meals on Wheels.
